Purpose of the Junior Board

The Junior Board was formed in order to reach a young population of community members to engage them in the fight against HIV/AIDS. The AIDS Foundation of Chicago has identified young adults as a key population that is affected by the HIV/AIDS epidemic.

- At least half of all new infections in the United States occur among young people under the age of 25; the vast majority of those young people are infected sexually.
- HIV/AIDS is the leading cause of death for African-American women aged 25-34 in the United States.

Junior Board activities include:

- Attending bi-monthly Junior Board meetings.
- Securing participants, teams, pledges, volunteers and/or other resources for the AIDS Run & Walk Chicago each September.
- Selling tickets and/or securing volunteers for World of Chocolate, AFC's annual Worlds AIDS Day holiday fundraiser.
- Volunteering, as necessary, for other AFC-sanctioned events.
- Volunteering for AFC advocacy and HIV/AIDS prevention outreach activities, particularly the - 2006 Speaker Series to be held on college campuses.
- Volunteering for AFC's grant-making program.
- Developing, planning, and producing at least one Junior Board fundraising event annually, designed specifically to attract a young audience (ages 21 – 35). Proceeds from the event will support AFC's grant-making, advocacy, and prevention programs.
