CRITICAL -

AIDS Foundation Chicago advocates for the protection and increase of Fiscal Year 2025 state funding for HIV and STI treatment and prevention services. For FY24, the state dedicated \$54.2 Million in critical investments for HIV/AIDS-related treatment and services. This initiative will help to meet the ongoing service need y \$4.5 Million through FY25.

INVESTMENTS

BUDGET BREAKDOWN

HIV LUMP SUM: \$27.5 MILLION

This funds HIV prevention and treatment services, including HIV testing and Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP), that will lead to the continued reduction of new HIV cases, especially when prioritized in communities where the need is greatest.

\$2 Million in new state funding compared to FY24

AFRICAN-AMERICAN HIV/AIDS RESPONSE FUND: \$15 MILLION

To address the disproportionate impact HIV has inflicted on Illinoisans living with or vulnerable to HIV and other chronic conditions, especially those in the Black community.

GETTING TO ZERO (GTZ-IL) INITIATIVE: \$5.5 MILLION


Funding that provides for an at-home HIV testing kit pilot program, HIV-related stigma reduction programs, housing for formerly homeless and unstably housed people living with HIV, increased access to PrEP, and HIV awareness and education across the state.

Level funding compared to FY24

RAPID START FOR HIV TREATMENT

Pilot program to establish treatment standards as starting HIV treatment within 7 days of initial diagnosis or within 7 days of referral to HIV medical care. This line item will build capacity at IDPH through a new role that will provide education, technical assistance, and coordination necessary to implement Rapid Start Pilot Sites.

\$2.5 Million in New State Appropriations



PREP MEDICATION ASSISTANCE: \$2 MILLION

IDPH program for uninsured and underinsured populations. PrEP4lllinois offers client navigation for PrEP services through education, medication access, referrals to PrEP-friendly clinicians, and enrollment navigation into payment assistance programs.

STI SCREENING AND EDUCATION: \$500K

Funding for expenses and programs related to prevention, screening and treatment services to address Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) cases.
